



HOUSE RULES OFFICIAL 538 DUTCH GRAND PRIX VILLAGE 2021

In order to ensure that the Official 538 Dutch Grand Prix Village (hereafter referred to as 'Village') is a place where everyone can enjoy their stay, there are a number of rules which apply to all visitors to the Village.

Article 1. Legislation and regulations

In the first place, Dutch legislation and the General Municipal Bylaw of the municipality of Zandvoort are applicable on the site of the Village. During their stay on the site, visitors to the Village must behave in a way that respects public order, common decency and propriety. Visitors are bound to follow the regulations and/or instructions of the organisation, security personnel, medical team and other parties involved in the Village. Threats, abuse, intimidation, discrimination and other forms of aggression are forbidden. The use of (soft)drugs is not permitted. In case of misbehaviour, disorder, urinating in public and/or infringement of the house rules, visitors will be removed from the site of the Village. Visitors identified as having weapons or committing theft, violence or other violations of the law will be reported to the police and a formal complaint will be filed.

Article 2. Own risk and liability

Visitors to the Village do so entirely at their own risk. The organisation of the Village is not liable for any damage arising from a visit to the Village or the loss and/or theft of personal property during the visit to the Village. Damage or injury to (temporary) objects and/or possessions and people (visitors/personnel) of the event will be recovered from the source.

Article 3. Searching, checks on bags and proof of identification

Upon entry or during the stay, the organisation is entitled to search visitors, to inspect hand luggage, bags and/or jackets and/or to ask for proof of identification. Refusal may result in access to the village being denied and may lead to removal from the village.

Article 4. Access

Access to the Village is only possible upon displaying a valid entry ticket, in combination with proof of ID and in combination with satisfying the established Covid-19 requirements. The minimum age for unaccompanied visitors to the Village is 18. Younger visitors will only be granted access if accompanied by an adult in possession of a valid entry ticket.

Access to the Village will be refused to persons:

- Who in any way give rise to nuisance and/or aggression.
- Who are in possession of and/or are under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
- Who are in possession of weapons. In that case the police will be summoned.
- Who cause any form of nuisance to the surrounding area.
- Who are wearing clothing of football clubs, manifestations of any motorcycle club (Outlaw Motorcycle Gang) and/or clothing with nationalistic signs or expressions, with the exception of national football shirts.

The organisation is entitled to reject visitors or to remove them from the site if they do not comply with the regulations referred to in article 1 or these house rules. After removal from the site, the visitor has no more access to the site and no claim can be made for reimbursement of entry tickets, travel costs and/or any other costs incurred.

In the interest of public order and safety, the organisation reserves the right to request visitors to leave the location at any time during the visit, for safety reasons. Following the end of the event (re) admission is no longer permitted.

Article 5. Prohibited goods

The following items may not be brought into the Village:

Soft or hard drugs, laughing gas, glassware, knives, laser pens, striking or stabbing weapons or firearms, or objects that resemble weapons or cause offence, generators, refrigerators, gas or oil lamps, gas bottles, gas cookers and (disposable) barbecues, aerosols (with the exception of sun cream, deodorant and perfume), candles, umbrellas (we recommend bringing ponchos as a precaution), musical instruments, horns or similar items, fireworks or flares, provocative material on clothes, pets (except

for guide dogs), advertising material such as leaflets, brochures, banners (unless approved and with the permission of the organisation), professional film, photography or sound recording equipment (unless approved and accredited by the organisation), drones (both on the ground and in the air).

All confiscated items will be thrown away in the special rubbish containers present for that purpose, and will not be retained in safe keeping.

Article 6. Food and drink

Bringing your own food and drink to the campsite of the Village is permitted, but is subject to a limit. You may bring a maximum of 4.5 litres of soft drinks and drink containing no more than 14.5% alcohol. Spirits are not allowed. All drinks must be sealed and contained in their original packaging. Glassware is prohibited; this will be strictly checked at the entrance. The use of BBQ's, all forms of gas cookers and naked flames is not permitted.

Food and drinks can be obtained in the Village. Together with our catering partner we offer a varied selection of food and drinks.

Article 7. Alcohol

Visitors under 18 years of age are forbidden from buying, accepting or consuming alcoholic drinks. Show your proof of ID if asked to do so. The organisation reserves the right to withhold the sale of alcohol in case of misbehaviour or drunkenness.

Article 8. Sound installations

Small battery-powered portable speakers with a maximum output of 30 watts are permitted, provided no nuisance is caused for other guests. The production of sound is only permitted between 08.00 and 23.30.

Article 9. Waste

We like a clean and healthy environment. Throw waste in the waste bin and keep the area around your sleeping accommodation clean.

Article 10. Advertising and promotion

The distribution on and around the site of brochures, leaflets or other (advertising) items is prohibited, without the consent of the organisation. In addition, no interviews may be held, no research carried out and no (non-) commercial promotion carried out without the consent of the organisation.

Article 11. Photographs and filming

Photographic, video and audio recordings are made at the Village. Upon entering the Village, visitors will be deemed to have given their consent to the organisation and third parties for these recordings to be made, reproduced, published and/or used for promotional and safety purposes. This also includes (camera) surveillance in the interest of preserving public order and safety on the site.

Visitors are not permitted to make recordings with professional filming or sound recording equipment without the permission or accreditation of the organisation. Filming with smartphones and small recording devices for personal use is permitted.

Article 12. Contact

In case of a life-threatening situation, call 112. In case of an emergency or incident, contact +31 (0)76 205 50 80.

Article 13. Miscellaneous

These house rules are subject to any supplementary security, public order and safety conditions imposed by the government or by a decision of the organisation itself. The organisation is therefore entitled to revise these house rules unilaterally at any time, and will then publish the revised house rules on the website www.dutchgp.com.

Article 14. Unforeseen situation

In the case of situations which are not provided for in the house rules, the organisation will decide on possible measures to be taken.
